Sunday after Theophany: On Wednesday we celebrated *Theophany* one of the greatest feasts of our church. His Baptism at the Jordan is the first manifestation of the Trinity. The *Sunday after Theophany* further highlights this observance. Jesus was revealed as the "*Messiah*" or the "*Anointed One of God*" in the Jordan. Today's Gospel [Matthew 4:12-17] describes the beginning of that ministry. It identifies the coming of Jesus, and his ministry which begins in Galilee, and the town of Capernaum. This is seen as a "great light" for people sitting in darkness and a dawning of light upon those in the shadow of death [Matthew 4:16].

<u>Blessed Water:</u> In approaching to draw the blessed water from Theophany, please *maintain six feet distance* as kept when approaching for Communion. *Hand Sanitizer* and *face masks* are on a table next to the blessed water. Use the hand sanitizer and wear a mask before you draw water.

<u>Blessing of Homes</u> Those who wish to have their home blessed with the water blessed on Theophany are asked to contact Father Jim to determine appropriate date as circumstances allow.

<u>Eastern Christian Formation</u> The *Christmas-Theophany vacation* for *ECF Classes* is from <u>Sunday, December 27</u> to <u>January 10</u>. Classes are to resume <u>Sunday, January 17</u>.

<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be **preparatory instruction** for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the **Mysteries of Christian Initiation** — **Baptism, Chrismation,** and **Eucharist**. Christian Initiation may be celebrated with the Sunday Divine Liturgy. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according the norms of Church law and practice.

<u>Crowning in Marriage:</u> A six month period of preparation is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a **required** part of the marriage preparation for all couples.
