Third Sunday of the Great Fast: "When, then, you make the sign of the cross on the forehead, arm yourself with a saintly boldness, and reinstall your soul in its old liberty; for you are not ignorant that the cross is a prize beyond all price. Consider what is the price given for your ransom, and you will never more be slave to any man on earth. This reward and ransom is the cross. You should not then, carelessly make the sign on the forehead, but you should impress it on your heart with the love of a fervent faith. The Great Fast: The Liturgy of Presanctified Gifts is on the Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent. On Saturday, March 13, the Fourth All Souls Saturday the Divine Liturgy and Panachida at Saints Peter and Paul, Portage is at 9:00 am. The Panachida and Reading of the Names of the Deceased follow the Vigil Divine Liturgy in Dunlo on March 13.

<u>Simple abstinence:</u> The law of simple abstinence forbids the use of meat, but permits eggs and dairy products. All faithful of the Archeparchy who receive the Eucharist are obliged to observe simple abstinence when prescribed. Abstinence is obligatory on <u>all Wednesdays</u> and <u>Fridays</u> of the Great Fast.

Also, please continue to remember *Prayer Partner* daily: "And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perfection, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God." <u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be **preparatory instruction** for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the **Mysteries of Christian Initiation** — **Baptism, Chrismation,** and **Eucharist**.
