Second Sunday of the Great Fast: The Gospel which is read today [Mark 2:1-12] shows how people are eager to be in the presence of Jesus, to hear him as "he preached the word to them" [Mark 2: 2. There are so many that they would not all fit in the house.

Lent is an opportunity to be in the presence of Jesus, to hear his word. And also, the Lord pronounces a word of forgiveness for the paralytic lowered through the roof and placed before Jesus. Lent is especially a time to seek that word of forgiveness which Jesus also announces to us. This happens in the *Holy Mysteries* [Sacraments]. We ae counselled to make use of Confession— *The Mystery of Repentance.* And when we receive the Body and Blood of the Lord in Holy Communion, it is "for the remission of sins and life everlasting"

The Great Fast: The Liturgy of Presanctified Gifts is on the Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent. On Saturday, March 6, the Third All Souls Saturday the Divine Liturgy and Panachida at Saints Peter and Paul, Portage is at 9:00 am. The Panachida and Reading of the Names of the Deceased follow the Vigil Divine Liturgy in Beaverdale on March 6.

<u>Simple abstinence:</u> The law of simple abstinence forbids the use of meat, but permits eggs and dairy products. All faithful of the Archeparchy who receive the Eucharist are obliged to observe simple abstinence when prescribed. Abstinence is obligatory on <u>all Wednesdays</u> and <u>Fridays</u> of the Great Fast.

Also, please continue to remember *Prayer Partner* daily: "And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more and more in knowledge and every kind of perfection, to discern what is of value, so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God." <u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be **preparatory instruction** for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the **Mysteries of Christian Initiation** — **Baptism, Chrismation,** and **Eucharist**.
