The Feast of Pentecost "On this the last and greatest day of the feast, the Lord pours forth the Holy Spirit in the form of tongues of fire upon his followers. On this day we are reminded of our baptism in fire and the Spirit, we are anointed with the manifold gifts of the Spirit, and we receive the courage and wisdom to proclaim the Gospel of the Lord." [Father David Petras, <u>Typicon</u>, p. 48]

Following the Ambon Prayer at the Divine Liturgy on *Pentecost* one of the *Kneeling Prayers of Pentecost* from Vespers of Sunday evening is prayed. On *Pentecost Monday*, after the Ambon Prayer, a procession takes place around the church, with the singing of the Pentecost Troparion and Kontakion. A Gospel is read at each side of the Church: 1) *Matthew 12:30-36*; 2) *Mark 13:9-13*; 3) *Luke 11:9-13*; 4) *John 16:2-14*. Each Gospel reading is a lesson on the Holy Spirit.
