<u>Pastor's Notebook:</u> The Gospel read today [<u>Luke 18:35-43</u>] presents Jesus passing near the place where a blind man sits along the road begging. The man asks what the chatter and commotion that he hears are about. He is told, "Jesus of Nazareth is passing by" [<u>Luke 18:37</u>].

We for our part have a moment to glance at the recent period of Christmas and Theophany. It is a time in which in the Liturgy and in our faith, Jesus indeed passes by. We are provided an opportunity of grace, in the presence of Jesus, in which we encounter him in a more vivid way than perhaps at other times. These days are for us a time of light.

For the blind man who sat begging, being in the presence of Jesus meant the light of receiving the gift of sight. But there is for him also an even more penetrating light: "Receive your sight; your faith has saved you" [Luke 18:42]. For the moment today, we are reminded to avail ourselves to this light, as the Lord passes by our way and seeks to draw us closer to him.
