Pastor's Notebook: We enter the Great Fast on Monday, February 28. While we have memories of our experience of Lent over the years, Lent is especially a time to look ahead, a new beginning. The disciplines of Lent are to assist us in this regard. Today's Epistle lesson [Romans 13:11-14] uses images of the dawning of a new day: *"Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light"*

<u>Lenten regulations</u> are listed in the insert. The first day of the Great Fast is a day of strict abstinence [from meat, dairy]; Wednesdays and Fridays are days of abstinence from meat. <u>Lenten services</u> ae in the schedule above.

Our Lenten journey this year includes the burden of the invasion and war in Ukraine. Metropolitan William's pastoral letter [enclosed] calls attention to this. On the *Third Sunday* of Lent an offering will be taken for our Byzantine Catholic Church in Ukraine and forwarded to the Eparchy of Mukachevo. Envelopes will be provided for this offering. Also, prayers for this concern will be included in the services during Lent

<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation:</u> Reid Thomas Crum received the Mysteries of Christian Initiation – Baptism, Chrismation, and Eucharist--on Saturday, February 26. He is the son of Shawn and Becky Crum. Many happy years!

<u>Cheesefare Sunday–Sunday of Forgiveness:</u> The Church urges us to begin the Great Fast by mutual forgiveness. Metropolitan Kallistos of Diokleia states: "Before we enter the Lenten fast, we are reminded that there can be no true fast, no genuine repentance, no reconciliation with God, unless we are at the same time reconciled with one another. A fast without mutual love is the fast of demons.</u> We do not travel the road of Lent as isolated individuals but as members of a family."

<u>Mysteries of Christian Initiation</u>: There is to be **preparatory instruction** for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the **Mysteries of Christian Initiation** – **Baptism, Chrismation,** and **Eucharist**. Christian Initiation may be celebrated with the Sunday Divine Liturgy. Those selected to be sponsors must be persons who are qualified to be a sponsor according the norms of Church law and practice.

<u>Crowning in Marriage:</u> A **six month period of preparation** is to precede the marriage. Couples are to meet with the pastor before other arrangements are scheduled. The **Pre-Cana Program** offered by the Archeparchy in the spring of each year is a **required** part of the marriage preparation for all couples.
