**The Lenten Journey:** Over the weeks of the Great Fast, a primary focus is on *repentance*. It begins as a change of heart: turning away from darkness, indifference, evil. Then in turn, we may turn toward the light of Christ, to an openness to what promotes a life of purpose, goodness, virtue. This process is identified in today's lesson from the Epistle to the Hebrews: "The blood of Christ" poured out on the cross for us, "shall purify your conscience from dead works to serve the living God". [Hebrews 9:14]

This Fifth Sunday of Lent highlights the story of Saint Mary of Egypt. You may read her story of sincere repentance and subsequent outstanding virtues on the back of the bulletin cover.
