The holy priest-martyr Theodore Romzha: Born in the village of Veliky Bychkiv in Transcarpathia in 1911, he came from a poor family and exhibited a vocation to the priesthood. Sent to Rome for studies, he was ordained in 1937 and sent to the country parish of Berzovo. In 1939, he was called to the seminary at Uzhorod and taught there until 1944. In 1944, despite his youth, he was ordained bishop for the Mukachevo Eparchy.

During the Soviet Army's occupation of the Transcarpathia region, he was tireless in his care for his flock and in his defense of the rights of the Byzantine Catholic Church. On October 27, 1947, he was severely wounded in a staged accident. He was taken to the hospital in Mukachevo, where he was subsequently poisoned, and died. (1947). We *celebrate his feast on Monday, October 31*.
