The Fathers of the First Six Councils

On the Sunday between July 13 and 19 is the commemoration of the *Fathers of the First Six Ecumenical Councils*. From these earliest Councils derives the Creed which we profess as the core of our faith. What we affirm and honor in this commemoration is not the personal holiness or individual gifts or achievements of these bishops who participated in these assemblies. Rather, it is their witness to the *orthodox faith*, the faith which correctly and fully establishes and teaches the beliefs most central to the Church.

The Holy and Glorious Prophet Elijah

On Monday, July 20 we celebrate the feast of the *Holy and Glorious Prophet Elijah*. The prophets had a role of importance in the Old Testament. Indeed a large portion of the Old Testament consists of the record of the sayings of the prophets.

The prophets were chosen by God to speak in his name, on his behalf. Indeed, the word "prophet" actually means in its root, "to speak for". They received certain gifts and authority to fulfill their mission. The common identification of a prophet emphasizes foretelling the future. This role or capacity, however, flows from this more primary role of preaching and exhortation. Their predictions of the future were a seal of authenticity of their message.

The Prophets are sometimes referred to as the "conscience of Israel", of God's people. In reminding people of God's faithfulness, they exhorted them to be faithful. One event from the Prophet Elijah illustrates this well. When King Ahab, noted to be a leader who acted contrary to God's law, met the Prophet Elijah he said to the prophet, "Is it you, you disturber of Israel" [I Kings 18:16]. By constant reminders to both king and people to be faithful to God's commandments and covenant, Elijah in a sense "disturbs" their consciences, trying to awaken them to their responsibilities.

At the end of Elijah's life, a flaming chariot and flaming horses lifts Elijah to heaven in a whirlwind [I<u>I Kings 2:11</u>]. Reference to this event is made in the *Blessing Automobiles and Other Vehicles* which has become a custom on the Feast of the Holy Prophet Elijah.

This *Blessing Automobiles and Other Vehicles* follows Vespers on Sunday evening [Beaverdale]; and the Divine Liturgy on Monday morning [Portage]. To participate in this, go to your vehicle after the *Dismissal* and wait there for the priest to approach and bless each vehicle.

Saint Michael's, South Fork Memorial Monument

Over several years and in particular in the past year, a monument at the site of the Saint Michael's Cemetery and the former Saint Michael's Church in South Fork has been planned.

A preliminary to providing this monument is mitigation of a severe drainage situation in the area in the front of the cemetery. Installation of pipe and a catch basin along Memory Lane, is being done with the cooperation of Croyle Township. This work to install the pipe and catch basin is in progress. We are grateful for the cooperation of Croyle Township and its Supervisors in this project.

A drainage system in the area in the front of the cemetery is then to be installed by a contractor. It includes a French drain to carry the water to the pipe and catch basin on Memory Lane. Once this drainage work has been installed and completed, the memorial monument can be erected. Because of the additional expense with the necessary drainage work, a modified monument is to be placed at the front of the cemetery. Our thanks once again to the donors who have responded to this appeal. A list acknowledging names of these donors will appear in the bulletin in the coming weeks.
