<u>Blessed Basil Hopko</u>: Today we observe the memory of the repose of +Blessed Basil Hopko, who served as an Auxiliary Bishop of our Greek Catholic Eparchy of Presov [Slovakia]. The son of poor, landless peasants, his father died when the boy was just a year old. When he was four his mother emigrated to the United States to look for work. Educated in Hungary, he was trained at the Seminary in Prešov, Czechoslovakia. He had dreams of joining his mother in the United States, and of persuing his vocation there. The cost of recurring health problems left him unable to afford to travel.

When he finally decided to serve in his native land, he was suddenly cured, and realized he was been given a sign about his calling. He was ordained in 1929, and served as a parish priest in Prague where he was noted for a mission to the poor, the unemployed, and to students. Ordained auxiliary bishop of Prešov in 1947, Bishop Basil was arrested April 28, 1950 as part of the Communist government's suppression of the Greek Catholic Church.

He was kept on starvation rations and tortured for weeks and was eventually given a show trial and sentenced to fifteen years for the "subversive activity" of staying loyal to Rome. He was repeatedly transferred from prison to prison, and continually abused. His health, physical and emotional, failed, and in 1964 he was transferred to a home for the aged and kept under guard there. While he managed to overcome severe depression, and went on to minister to a group of one hundred and twenty nuns imprisoned at the home, he never recovered his physical health. His death was a direct result of imprisonment, and he is considered one of the many martyred by Communism.

+Bishop-Martyr Basil Hopko is one of the many heroic witnesses of our Greek Catholic Church during the era of Communism. We ask for his intersession to strengthen our faith and hope.
