<u>Scripture Reflection:</u> Our salvation is to be found not simply in words or teachings. Rather, it is the events that are found in Scripture, what God has *done* in our behalf. This is seen especially in the great moments of the Exodus in the Old Testament; and the death and resurrection of our Lord. We find this today, in the episode in which Jesus expels demons.

In today's Gospel [Matthew 8:28-9:1] Jesus establishes order out of chaos; also brings light out of darkness; and life out of death. The existence of these two men is clouded by the chaos of demonic possession and the darkness and death this causes. By a single word, Jesus overcomes these. Our salvation is accomplished in the same way, less dramatically but no less effectively.
