The blessing grapes and other fruit takes place today, as we give thanks to God for the harvest of the summer fruits.

The fasts of the Church Year invite us to a concerted effort to put God first in our lives through prayer; almsgiving, and fasting. Deacon Tyler's Pilgrimage to Constantinople/Istanbul, Turkey

The first leg of my two-week pilgrimage was spent in Constantinople. Also known as the city of Byzantium, Constantinople became the capital of the Roman Empire in 330 AD. It is here that the Byzantine rite developed. I arrived on July 11th, which happens to be the feast day of St. Euphemia. Her relics are kept in the Patriarchal Church of St. George. Since it was her feast day, my group visited St. George's and venerated her relics, which were exposed and placed in the middle of the church. We also prayed before the relics of St. John Chrysostom and St. Basil the Great at the cathedral. I spent the following days touring the Bosporus Strait, enjoying kebabs, and visiting churches. Sadly, many of the ancient Christian churches have been converted into Mosques. Very little iconography remains at these sites. Praying at the great church of Hagia Sophia was incredible. I closed my eyes and imagined our liturgy being celebrated there centuries ago. Another moving experience occurred inside the church of Hagia Irene. So much of what I have learned at seminary came to life at this church. The Creed we chant at every liturgy was finalized at Hagia Irene during the First Council of Constantinople. You can still see where all the bishops would have sat during the council behind the altar. While I spent only four days in Turkey, much ground was covered.
