Feast of the Holy Archangel Michael and all Angelic Powers...is observed Wednesday November 8. We learn of the existence of the angels and their role and identity in the Bible. They were created by God and are immortal, as they do not die. Their activity in the Scriptures is especially as messengers and guardians. They are companions and guides for those who travel. They are also warriors on God's behalf in the struggle with evil. This role is identified with the Archangel Michael.

Angels are also members of the heavenly court; thus, they are always in God's presence, to give glory and worship to God. The name "angel" means in its root, "messenger", as they are sent by God to convey his message, for human beings. This is often for those who have a particular role in God's plan of salvation. The Archangel Gabriel is sent to the Virgin Mary [Luke 1:26-38]; and to Zechariah [Luke 1:5-25] to announce the birth of Jesus and of John the Baptist.

Mysteries of Christian Initiation: There is to be preparatory instruction for parents and godparents prior to the celebration of the Mysteries of Christian Initiation — Baptism, Chrismation, and Eucharist.
