The Great Fast: The *Mid-point* of Lent is on Wednesday of this *Fourth Week of the Great Fast*. During this week we venerate the Cross, which stands at the center of our salvation.

The cross and what is signifies for us may be called the "law of Lent". We find a concise express of this in today's Gospel: "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" [Mark 8:34]
