The Great Fast: The First Sunday of the Great Fast was originally dedicated to the memory of the Holy Prophets of the Old Covenant. In today's Gospel, Philip tells Nathaniel, "We have found the one about whom Moses wrote in the law, and also the prophets". [John 1:45] On March 11, 843, the Empress Theodora made a solemn procession to celebrate the victory of true faith in icons. This became an annual feast, and displaced the memory of the prophets.

The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is offered on Wednesday and Friday during the Great Fast. The Mystery of Repentance [Confessions] is available Wednesday and Friday prior to the Liturgy of Presanctified Gifts at 5:30 pm.; and Saturday at 1:00 p.m.
